Diagnosed just days apart - both BRCA1-positive.

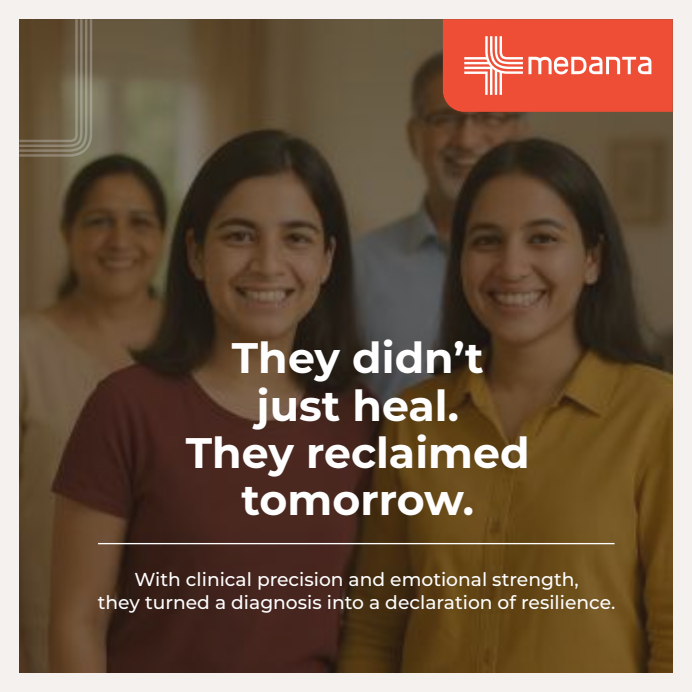
One with a triple-negative tumour. The shock was immense, but their response was immediate and united.
